UPSC CAPF 2020 exam notification was postponed because of the coronavirus pandemic. The UPSC will announce the CAPF notification dates on June 5, 2020.

CAPF is a competitive exam conducted by the Union Public Service Commission to recruit the candidates in the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF). The candidates recruited through this exam, join the forces as Assistant Commandant (AC).

- Border Security Force (BSF)
- Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF)
- Central Industrial Security Force (CISF)
- Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP)
- Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB)

UPSC CAPF 2020 Eligibility Criteria

UPSC describes the eligibility criteria for the CAPF exam in the official notification. The eligibility conditions for UPSC CAPF are explained below:

Nationality:

- The candidate must be a citizen of India.
- The candidates who are subject of Nepal and Bhutan are also allowed to apply in the exam.



- No other candidate can apply for the UPSC CAPF exam.

Age limit for CAPF Exam 2020

The lower age limit for the CAPF exam is 20 years and the upper age limit is less than 25 years. The age is calculated from August 1 of the exam year. For appearing in the UPSC CAPF exam 2020, the candidates must have been born not earlier than August 2, 1995 and not later than August 1, 2000.

The upper age limit prescribed above will be relaxable.

Category	Relaxation
Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe	five years
Other Backward Classes	three years
Civilian Central Government Servants	five years Ex-Servicemen will also be eligible for this relaxation.
Domiciled in the State of Jammu & Kashmir during the period from January 1, 1980 to December 31, 1989	five years

However, the total relaxation claimed on account of Government Service will be limited to five years.

Educational Qualification for CAPF 2020

As given in the official CAPF notification, "the candidate must hold a Bachelors degree from any recognised university"

The candidates who appear in the final year of their degree course can also apply for the exam but they have to produce the final year mark sheet of the qualifying exam with the detailed application form.

Possession of NCC 'B' or 'C' Certificates:

The candidates having the NCC 'B' or 'C' Certificate will be given preference at the time of Interview. These qualifications will be given consideration at the time of Interview/Personality Test only.

Physical Standards

The UPSC CAPF notification prescribes the physical and medical standards in a very comprehensive manner. The important points related to the CAPF physical standards are given below. The minimum requirements for the candidate are as follows:

UPSC CAPF 2020 Selection Process

After the successful filling up the UPSC CAPF Application form and submitting the exam fees, the admit card will be issued to the candidates in online mode only. The UPSC CAPF exam consists of three stages. All three stages are given below:

UPSC CAPF Exam Stage I - Written Exam - 450 marks

The stage I is the written examination. The written exam consists of two papers-

The paper I will be the objective type question paper and paper II will be the conventional essay type question paper having two parts.

UPSC CAPF Exam Stage II - Physical Standards/Physical Efficiency Tests and Medical Standards Tests

The Physical Efficiency and Medical Standard test are only qualifying in nature. The candidates need to meet the standard prescribed in the CAPF notification.

After passing the Stage I, the candidates need to undergo the Physical Efficiency and Medical Standard Test.

Pregnancy at the time of PET will be a disqualification and pregnant female candidate will be rejected.

UPSC CAPF Stage III: Interview/Personality Test - 150 marks

The candidates declared passed in the second stage of the CAPF exam, will be called for the interview/personality test. The interview/ personality test will be conducted on the UPSC premises in New Delhi. After the interview/personality test, the final result will be declared.

Restriction on appearing in UPSC CAPF

Any candidate who has been selected as the Assistant Commandant in any of the forces are restricted to apply again in the exam.

UPSC CAPF 2020 Tie-Breaking Principle

UPSC issued new guidelines for the tie-breaking resolving. The candidates having equal marks in the final aggregate total is called a tie situation and such a situation will be resolved based on the age of the candidate. It means that in the case of tie-breaking, the older candidate will be given preference in the rank.

UPSC CAPF FAQs

Q. How many times the CAPF exam is conducted in a year?

A. UPSC conducts the CAPF exam once every year. But the exam process is long and usually takes more than one year to complete.

Q. Is the assistant commandant a gazetted officer?

A. Yes, the Assistant Commandant is the gazetted officer recruited directly through the CAPF exam. He/She is the commanding officer of an armed force unit.

Q. How many attempts are there for UPSC CAPF?

A. The number of attempts is not mentioned in the official UPSC CAPF notification. Only the upper age limit is fixed. It implies that the candidates can appear any number of times till he/she attains 25 years of age.

Q. Is there any negative marking in UPSC CAPF exam?

A. Yes, the CAPF written exam paper 1 has the negative marking of One by three. It means for each wrong answer, 33% of marks assigned to that will be deducted as a penalty.

Q. What is the exam cycle of the UPSC CAPF exam?

A. The UPSC issues the CAPF notification in April month and the final result is declared in September of the next year.

Q. Is there any descriptive paper in the UPSC CAPF Exam?

A. Yes, in the CAPF written exam, there are two papers. The paper 2 is descriptive in nature.

Q. Can females apply in the CAPF exam?

A. Yes, the females can also apply in the CAPF exam and are treated at par with the male counterpart. There are relaxed criteria for qualifying the physical/medical exam.

Q. Who conducts the Physical/Medical test in the UPSC CAPF exam?

A. The UPSC designate an authority to conduct the physical and medical exam. The result of that authority is final in the matters of the physical and medical exam.

Q. How many candidates apply in the UPSC CAPF exam?

A. Around 3 lakh candidates apply for the UPSC CAPF exam each year. But only 50% appear in the written exam. Around one lakh candidates appear in the written exam and only around three thousand candidates qualify for the Physical/Medical exam.

Q. What is UPSC CAPF DAF?

A. DAF means the Detailed Application form. The DAF is mandatory to be filled for the UPSC CAPF exam. It requires all the academic and professional details of the candidate.

Q. What is the Age limit for CAPF?

The age limit for the general category candidates is 25 years. But there is age relaxation provided to the reserved category candidates.

UPSC CAPF application form is the first step to become a part of the CAPF selection process. The UPSC CAPF online application will start only after the notification. UPSC will release the [CAPF notification](#) on April 22, 2020 and the online application for CAPF will start after that.

How to fill the UPSC CAPF Application Form 2020?

All the UPSC application form has two parts and the CAPF is not an exception. Following are the steps to fill both the parts are given below:

CAPF Application Part 1

The candidates can fill the UPSC CAPF application at the official site only. The steps to fill the UPSC CAPF online application are given below:

1. Visit the official website <https://upsconline.nic.in/> and click on the link, online application for various examinations of UPSC.
2. On clicking the link, a new page will open, choose the UPSC CAPF exam and start filling the application form
3. Click on the "Click Here for Part-I" link given under Part-I registration tab.
4. An instructions page will appear on the screen on clicking the above tab
5. Read and understand the given instructions and proceed only after understanding them fully

On clicking above, CAPF application form (part-I) will appear on the screen. Part-I registration requires personal detail as given below

- Name
- Gender
- Date of birth
- Nationality
- Marital status
- Parents' names
- Email ID
- Postal address
- Educational qualification, etc.



UPSC CAPF Application Fee

After filling the personal details in part 1, the candidates need to submit the application fees. Please note that there is no application fee for the females and the candidates belonging to SC and ST category.

The application fee for the General and OBC category is Rs 200.

Mode of Submitting Application Fee

The candidates can submit the application fee either by cash or by an online transaction. The details are given below:

Online mode: Candidates can make online payment of UPSC CAPF application fee via any credit/debit card or internet banking.

Offline mode: Candidates can also pay the application fee by cash. The candidate needs to print the system generated pay-in-slip during part II registration and deposit the fee at the counter of SBI Branches on the next working day.

Candidates must note that the 'Pay by Cash' mode will be deactivated one day before the application process closes. However, candidates who have generated their pay-in-slip before the process is deactivated can make the payment at any SBI branch during banking hours on the closing date.

After paying the application fee, candidates need to click on the "Continue" button and fill their preference for Combined Armed Police Forces (CAPF) exam centre. Thereafter, candidates need to upload their scanned photo and signature as per the specifications are given above. After the online fee submission, a declaration page will appear on the screen. Candidates need to click on the "I Agree" button and must agree to the declaration given by UPSC. Thereafter, candidates can submit the form by clicking on the "Submit" button.

CAPF Application Form Part II

Candidates need to click on the "Click Here for Part II" link present on the official website of UPSC.

- On clicking the link, a new page will appear wherein candidates need to enter their registration ID and the date of birth and click on the submit button.
- On clicking the button, CAPF part-II application form will appear on the screen.
- Candidates need to fill the required details and click on the "Submit" button.

On submission of part-II, CAPF exam application form is finally submitted.

Detailed Application Form (DAF) for UPSC CAPF exam 2020

The interview/personality test is the last stage of the UPSC CAPF exam. The candidates need to fill the Detailed Application Form (DAF) for the interview/personality test. The DAF is very important and requires all the academic and professional details of the candidate. In addition to that, it also requires the preference of the posts. The CAPF interview is majorly based on the DAF, general studies topics and current affairs.

The UPSC CAPF exam is conducted in three phases. These include the following

- Written Examination
- Physical Standards / Physical Efficiency Test (PET) and Medical Test
- Interview/Personality Test

Each phase of the CAPF exam is important and essential to pass to appear in the successive stage of the exam.

UPSC CAPF Exam Pattern–Written Exam



This is the first and only written exam in the [UPSC CAPF exam](#). There are two papers in the written exam. The written exam is conducted offline and the scheme of the exam is as follows

Subject Paper	Paper Type	Marks
General Ability and Intelligence	Objective(Multiple Answer) Type	250
General Studies, Essay and Comprehension	Descriptive Type	200

The General Studies, Essay and Comprehension paper will have a time duration of three hours. The candidates can write their answers in English or Hindi. But the questions based on precise writing, comprehension, and other communication/language skills will be in English only and their answers will be accepted in English only.

Candidates will be required to mention the medium of Essay Component in the attendance list and on the answer book. As per the official notification, UPSC will not give any credit for the Essay Component if the candidate writes the essay in the language other than mentioned in the attendance list and answer book.

The commission will fix minimum qualifying numbers separately for each paper (CAPF Cut off). The second paper of only those candidates will be evaluated who qualify in the first paper and score equal to or more than the cut-off marks.

UPSC CAPF Exam Pattern – PST/PET and Medical

The UPSC CAPF exam has a different pattern because the physical and medical test is conducted before the interview. The physical and medical test is qualifying in nature only and no marks are assigned to these tests.

The candidates need to qualify the Physical Efficiency Test (PET) conducted by the assigned authority appointed by the Ministry of Home and the qualifying standards are defined as below.

Note: Pregnancy at the time of PET will render the female candidates disqualified and consequently they will be rejected.

The candidates can appeal against the medical test result. This appeal will be considered by the Appellate Authority, appointed for this purpose by the Ministry of Home, within the period of 15 days only.

UPSC CAPF Exam Pattern–Interview/Personality Test

The personality test carries 150 marks. Candidates who qualify the PET/PST and medical test will be called for the CAPF interview/personality test. The interview is conducted at the UPSC office premises in New Delhi. The interview revolves around the personal background of the candidate, current events and the security issues important for the nation.

Candidates who are declared medically unfit but allowed to appear before the “Review Medical Board” on their appeal by the Appellate Authority will be called for Interview/Personality Tests provisionally.

[UPSC CAPF result](#) is declared based on the marks secured in the written exam and interview/personality test.

Syllabus

UPSC CAPF syllabus is defined in the Union Public Service Commission’s official notification. The CAPF syllabus for the written exam is very important because there is only one written exam and it has the highest proportion (weightage of 75%) of marks in the total marks.

The written exam is the single most important and critical phase of the UPSC CAPF exam and hence its syllabus occupies the highest position in the hierarchy of UPSC CAPF preparation.

UPSC CAPF 2020 Syllabus – Written Exam

The written exam is the most important stage of the [UPSC CAPF exam](#). There are two papers in the written exam. The first paper is General Mental ability and General Science. These are very broad nomenclature and the detail name of topics are given below.

Paper I - General Mental ability and General Science

1. General Mental Ability

The objective of this section's questions is to test the logical reasoning, quantitative aptitude including numerical ability, and data interpretation of the candidates.

2. General Science

The questions from this section will be designed to test the general awareness, scientific temper, comprehension and appreciation of scientific phenomena of everyday observation including new areas of importance like Information Technology, Biotechnology and Environmental Science. The candidates need to read the newspaper's Science and Technology columns regularly to answer the questions of this section.

3. Current Events of National and International Importance

Current affairs is a critical section for all the competitive exams. The questions from current affairs will test the candidates' awareness of current events of national and international importance in the broad areas of culture, music, arts, literature, sports, governance, societal and developmental issues, industry, business, globalisation, and interplay among nations.

4. Indian Polity and Economy

Indian Polity and the Constitution of India are common topics for all UPSC exams. The depth of the question varies from exam to exam. The candidates are suggested to read the Constitution of India in its entirety first and then only read the other reference books. Indian Economy and its constituents are the other common topic for UPSC exams.

The questions from this section shall aim to test candidates' knowledge of the country's political system and the Constitution of India, social systems and public administration, economic development in India, regional and international security issues and human rights including its indicators.

5. History of India

This is common to all and the important thing is that it can't change. Only some additions can be done with the help of research and discoveries. The History of India, which includes Ancient History, Medieval History and Modern History, is the cornerstone for preparing any competitive exam. Indian Freedom struggle is the most important topic among them all.

The UPSC questions will broadly cover the subject in its social, economic and political aspects. This shall also include the areas of growth of nationalism and freedom movement.

6. Indian and World Geography

Geography is the basis of the general knowledge topics and if the candidate understands the geography topics, it provides him with an edge over his competitors. The geography questions shall cover the physical, social and economic aspects of geography pertaining to India and the World.

Paper-II: General Studies, Essay and Comprehension

This paper is designed to check the comprehension abilities and to know about the worldview of the candidate. The Essay question will ask to write an essay on a topic which will have its roots in the current affairs, the socio-basic fabric of the country, ongoing problem of a country and the likes. It is expected from the candidates to provide a long term sustainable solution of the problem asked in the question.

Part A Essay – 80 Marks

The candidates need to write 4 essays in either English or Hindi. The indicative topics are:

- Modern Indian history especially of the freedom struggle
- Geography
- Polity and economy
- Knowledge of security and human rights issues and analytical ability

Part-B – Comprehension, précis writing, other communications/language skills – 120 Marks

This section will have the question in English only and the candidates can answer them in English only. The topics are



- Comprehension passages,
- précis writing,
- developing counter arguments,
- simple grammar and other aspects of language testing.

If the candidate scores high in this phase and qualifies the physical and medical test, there will be high chances that his name will appear in the final merit list.

UPSC CAPF 2020 Syllabus Interview/Personality Test

The UPSC CAPF syllabus for the UPSC CAPF Interview/Personality Test is not mentioned anywhere. The UPSC interview board can ask anything in the interview but most probably the questions asked from the current events, security issues and sometimes from the operational behaviour of the Central Armed Police Forces.

UPSC CAPF Admit Card – Written Exam

UPSC issues the CAPF admit card for each phase of exam and each time the candidates need to download the admit card from the official website. The CAPF admit card for the written exam is issued three weeks before the exam date. The CAPF exam centres are situated across the nation and the candidates need to appear in the exam in one of these exam centres.

UPSC CAPF Admit Card –Physical Standard Test

The UPSC conducts the written exam and the qualified candidates are called for the physical standard test/ Medical examination. Each year this physical test is conducted by CRPF. The admission card for the physical and medical test is issued by CRPF. It conducts the exam on behalf of the Ministry of Home.

CAPF admit card – Personality Test

UPSC issues the CAPF admit card for the personality test to the candidates who qualify the physical and medical test conducted by CRPF. The UPSC CAPF personality test is conducted in the UPSC Office, New Delhi.

How to check the UPSC CAPF Result?

The candidates can check the [UPSC CAPF exam](#) result by following the given steps

Step 1: Go to the official website - upsc.gov.in

Step 2: Click on the CAPF Result appearing in the "What's New" section on the right-hand side

Step 3: A new page will appear showing the PDF link of the CAPF written result

Step 4: Click on the link given under the "Documents" column, the written result pdf will open

Step 5: Search the roll number

Step 6: Download the CAPF result pdf for future reference.

The candidates, who qualify the written exam, are called for the physical and medical examination. UPSC designates an authority for this stage of examination.

UPSC CAPF Physical/Medical Examination Result

The Physical/Medical examination is the second stage of the UPSC CAPF selection process. Though the Physical/Medical exam is only qualifying in nature, it is mandatory to pass this stage of the exam. The physical test and the medical standard exam are conducted by the designated authority.

UPSC CAPF Final result

The UPSC CAPF Final result 2020 will be announced in September 2021. The CAPF final result takes into account the marks obtained in the CAPF written exam and CAPF interview(personality test). The Physical exam is only qualifying in nature and has no contribution to the final merit.

The UPSC CAPF final result is declared in the PDF mentioning the rank, roll numbers, names, and marks in the written and interview/personality test. After the results, the candidates are recommended to the respective forces for appointment formalities.
